

Frequently Asked Questions about applying to KCCC

What is First Chance Application Night, and why should I attend?

Open House & First Chance Application Night will be held at the Knox County Career Center from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Thursday, November 21, 2019. We encourage students and parents/guardians to attend so we can assist you in person with the process. Everyone attending Open House will be given the opportunity to apply that night before the application goes live on our website on November 22, 2019.

Can I lose my spot once provisionally accepted?

Yes. Acceptance is dependent upon your successful completion of the current school year. Attendance, discipline, and academic performance can impact your final acceptance.

What do I do after I receive my provisional acceptance?

Continue to work hard and finish your year strong! Remember, you must successfully complete this school year to meet our criteria mentioned earlier. If you are applying to an oversubscribed program, your GPA and attendance become increasingly important. Everything remains contingent on your final transcript.

What does it mean if my application is placed on hold?

You have not yet met the provisional acceptance criteria. Final determination will be made once final transcripts are received.

What happens if I want to change programs, or I don't get in my first choice program?

There are multiple options, so feel free to communicate with us, and we are happy to help.
